**The delivery of a decision on environmental conditions for a project involving:
"Construction and operation of Poland's first Nuclear Power Plant, with an electrical capacity of up to 3,750 MWe, in the area of Choczewo, or Gniewino and Krokowa communes" in accordance with Article 6 of the Convention on Environmental Impact Assessment in a Transboundary Context (the Espoo Convention)¹**

On 19 September 2023, the General Director for Environmental Protection issued a decision specifying the environmental conditions for the implementation of a project involving "Construction and operation of Poland's first Nuclear Power Plant, with an electrical capacity of up to 3,750 MWe, in the area of Choczewo, or Gniewino and Krokowa communes", planned to be implemented as option 1—location: Lubiatowo-Kopalino, technical sub-option 1A.
