Information about the upcoming consultation in accordance with Articles 4 and 5 of the Espoo convention for the 'Nord Stream 2, two route alternatives south of Bornholm on the continental shelf'

Denmark, as Party of origin regarding the Nord Stream 2 Project, would like to inform you about the upcoming Espoo consultation for the 'Nord Stream 2, two route alternatives south of Bornholm on the continental shelf in Denmark and how the consultation process will be performed.

The developer (the Nord Stream 2 AG) plan on submitting an application for two South-eastern route variants on the continental shelf in Denmark by April 15th 2019 together with the EIA-documentation for these routes. A non-technical summary, summary of the application, the transboundary environmental impact assessment and a draft permit is translated into your country's national language. We will send the consultation letter in English in an e-mail together with links to the documents in English and your country's national language to you on May 8th 2019. In parallel, we will forward a memory stick by ordinary mail to you and the developer will provide one hard copy of the documents and if more is required you are welcome to return to ask for more. The documents will also be available from May 15th 2019 on the Danish Energy Agency's website.

Our intention is that the consultation period will start on May 15th 2019 and to ask you to submit your comments no later than July 17th 2019.

We will as Party of origin provide more detailed information in the consultation letter to you on how the national consultation/information will be organized and carried out.

For your information:

The Espoo consultation for a South-eastern route in the Danish territorial
waters (Base Case route) in Denmark was conducted June – September 2017
and for a North-western route in Denmark was conducted October –
December 2018. The case process of these applications and the EIA is at an
advanced stage.
